Winter Weather May Cause School Cancellations



With winter weather upon us, severe weather may cause school to be released early or cancelled for the day. When school is closed or canceled due to inclement weather or an emergency situation, an official announcement will be issued through the news media. Parents should monitor local media outlets such as TV stations to determine if school is closed or will be released early. Whenever possible, the district will also utilize the "First Hand" notification system to alert community members by email and text-messaging. Winter Recess

Students are expected to go out to recess each day. Appropriate clothing and shoes should be worn for outside activities. On days when the temperature and/or wind chill is above 20 degrees Fahrenheit and the playground is cleared of most snow and ice, there will be outdoor recess.

If your child is to be excused from recess, a note explaining why is required. To be excused from recess for more than three days, a written doctor's note is required.

Engineering at Play

Every time your youngster has fun on the playground swings, he has engineering to thank! Let him explore engineering for himself by constructing a play swing set. He might use craft sticks for the frame, yarn for the chains, and cardboard for the seat. How could he make a swing that gives a longer "ride"? Suggest that he adjust the length of the chain and then test it each time. He can set a timer for one minute, pull back the seat and count the swings per minute. What does he notice? (The shorter the chain, the more swings per minute).

Taking the Lead

You may have heard the phrase "a born leader." But leadership skills such as speaking up and taking initiative, can be learned. Encourage your youngster to practice during group projects. For example, she might suggest a way to divide up tasks or offer to give the introduction during the group's class presentation.
